Harvest: September 24th

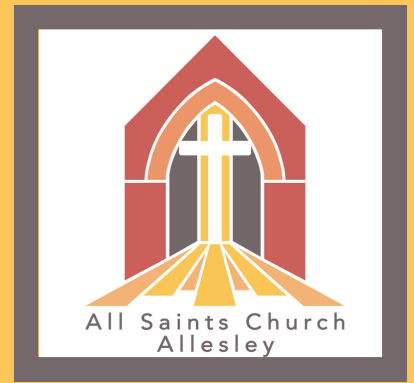
